# ABOUT MPI

## Metropolitan Peace Initiatives

Metropolitan Peace Initiatives (MPI), a division of Metropolitan Family Services (MFS), convenes community-based and citywide organizations to help heal Chicago's communities experiencing the highest levels of gun violence.

MPI coordinates, supports and sustains a cross agency infrastructure comprised of local community-based and citywide hyperlocal organizations known as Communities Partnering 4 Peace (CP4P), which delivers a comprehensive set of services to heal communities at the highest risk of violence.

MPI's core focus areas include: **Behavioral Health Services, Workforce Development, the Metropolitan Peace Academy (MPA), Justice Corps: Legal Aid and Youth Interventions.**

MPI's vision is to live in an equitable Chicago that is free of violence where all children, youth and families live happy and fulfilled lives.



# ABOUT CP4P

## Communities Partnering 4 Peace

Convened by MPI, Communities Partnering 4 Peace (CP4P), is a framework that provides a comprehensive, long-term approach to reducing gun violence among the communities it serves.

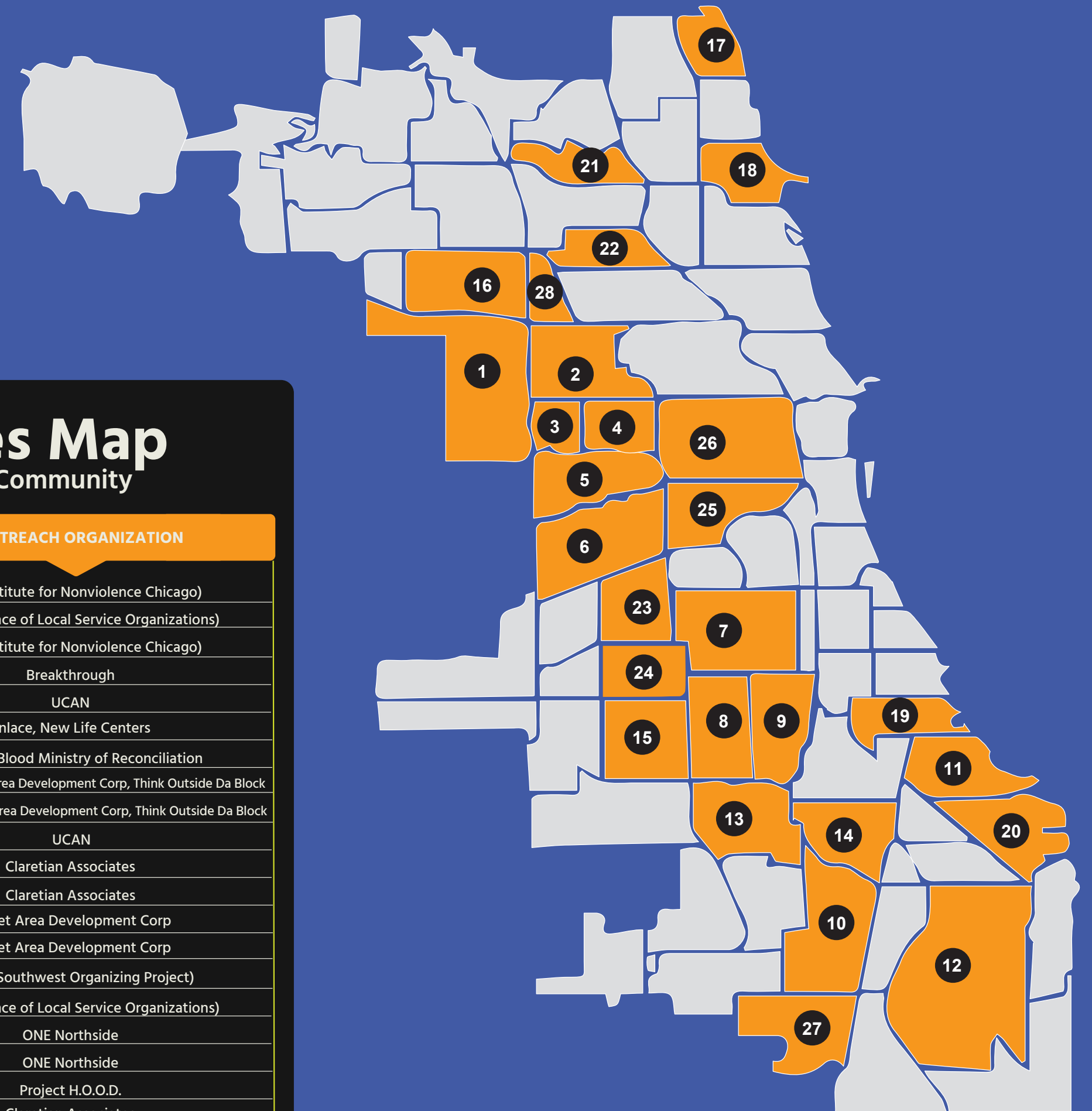
Comprised of 15 hyperlocal organizations working across 28 neighborhoods, CP4P is reducing violence and saving lives.

## Our CP4P Partner Organizations & Communities

CP4P targets individuals most at risk of perpetrating gun violence or becoming victims of gun violence, and provides:

- Intervention by trained **street outreach workers** to stop violence before it occurs
- **Case management** services such as **victim services, behavioral health, education and job training, transitional housing, and re-entry support** services for returning citizens
- Community-based events, called **“Light in the Night,”** that build community safety and solidarity
- Intensive training for street outreach workers provided by the **Metropolitan Peace Academy**
- **Intervention programming** that aims to reengage youth who have been disconnected from the educational system

According to Northwestern University’s Center for Neighborhood Engaged Research and Science (CORNERS), CP4P helped prevent at least 383 shootings and homicides between 2017 and 2021.

Showcase success stories within MPI/CP4P's 28 highest risk communities, which often include life-changing transformations amongst CP4P participants, upward employee career mobility, certification attainment and financial stability

Highlight relevant partnerships that allow MPI/CP4P to better serve our clients where they are:

- Southland RISE, a unique collaboration with the University of Chicago Medicine and Advocate Health which strengthens and integrates existing violence recovery and trauma care services throughout Chicago's South Side and across the south suburbs
- City Colleges of Chicago, provides 10-week certification training in CNC machine learning and forklift operation as part of the CP4P Workforce Development Program
- Partnership for Safe and Peaceful Communities (PSPC), a consortium of private foundations and individual donors who provided seed money to found CP4P and continues to provide support
